PENGUIN PARADE

Education groups are invited to experience this spectacular natural phenomenon. Explore the visitor centre before making your way through penguin habitat to the beach. Then enjoy the magic of watching these amazing seabirds waddle from the ocean to their burrows.

Penguins come ashore around sunset every evening. For Penguin Parade General Viewing, all groups must arrive at least one hour prior to penguin arrival.

KOALA CONSERVATION RESERVE

Education groups can explore the biodiverse remnant eucalypt forest, discovering koalas, other bushland species and their unique features, adaptations and requirements.

The reserve is open daily from 10am.

KOALA CONSERVATION TOUR

Add a guided experience to your visit.

Gurrborra is the Bunurong name for koala. Understanding this unique marsupial is important as we protect habitat and create sustainable futures. View koalas from our tree-top boardwalks in semi-wild enclosures. Students will learn about specialised features, adaptations, life cycles and the conservation of bushland biodiversity.
