Welcome to the March 2024 Volunteer Newsletter. We apologise for the delay in this month's edition. It's been a busy month with plenty of news to share, so let's get into it.

Volunteer Induction 27 March - Visitor Experience Churchill Island

Do you enjoy learning and sharing history? We are holding an induction for Visitor Experience Volunteers at Churchill Island. The role involves engaging visitors and sharing information about the heritage and what to do on Churchill Island. Volunteers can choose to get into the spirit of the Island by dressing in period costume (supplied) or dress in our regular volunteer uniform. Shifts are 10.00am – 12.30pm or 1.00pm to 4.00pm daily. We require a commitment of at least one shift per month, but otherwise allow volunteers to self-schedule subject to their availability.

The induction will include an overview of Churchill Island history, a tour of the farm, OHS induction and how to sign up for shifts. Once the induction is completed, if you choose to sign up, we will organise 'buddy shifts' until you feel comfortable going solo.

We will also assist in signing you up to My Impact, our volunteer management software, if you do not already have an existing profile.
